SC finished the District Track Meet with 2 District Championships and seven athletes qualifying for state competition. I look forward to assisting in new development of school structures, and ideas, planning of events, and all around PR type things. thank you for this opportunity.

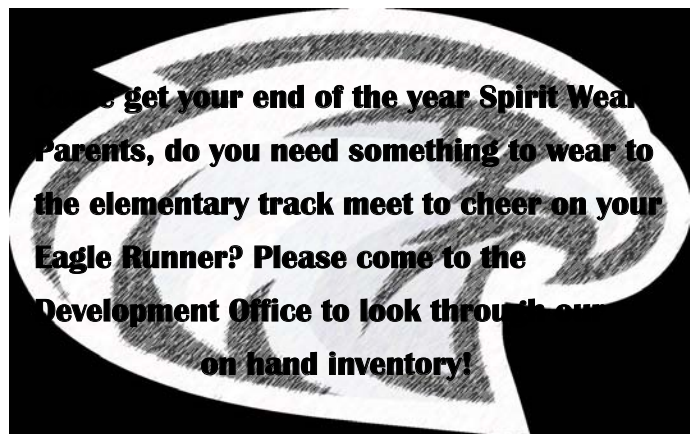
MINI SESSIONS

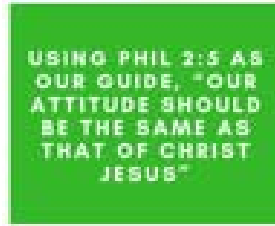
