SAT REVIEW COURSE

To Juniors, Seniors & their Parents - SAT Review Course

Assistance League® will be offering an SAT Review course for high school juniors and seniors enrolled in Benton County schools beginning in October 2019. The purpose of the course is to help students become familiar with the SAT and to develop strategies for success. The course consists of six class periods offered either on Saturday mornings or on Tuesday evenings. Four class sessions will focus on math and verbal instruction; the fifth session will include a practice test; the sixth (last) session will be devoted to returning the test and providing feedback.

FALL 2019 session:

Tuesday evening from 7:00-9:30pm on October 15, 22, 29, November 5, 12, 19
Saturday morning from 9:00-11:30am on October 19, 26, November 2, 9, 16, 23

Registration will begin for the Fall 2019 session on September 12, 2019. A registration fee of \$45 covers instruction (by instructors familiar with the SAT test), study guide, and snacks during the breaks. Registration forms will be available online at www.alcorvallis.org and in the high school Career Center on September 12, 2019. A few scholarships are available (please check with the career center). All registration forms need to be mailed to Assistance League with a \$45 check included by October 10, 2019. Early registration is encouraged. There is a limit of 120 students (60 on Tuesday and 60 on Saturday).
