

Character Trait October 25-29 is Determination

Proverbs 11:3, “The integrity of the upright guides them”

CHARACTER: the qualities built into an individual's life that determine their responses, regardless of circumstances.

Determination: Overcoming obstacles in order to reach my goal.

Weekly Verse: Philippians 4:13 “I can do all this through Him who gives me strength.”

Bible Story: The book of Nehemiah tells the amazing story of a small group of Jews rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem against fierce opposition. It is a fascinating story, culminating with this statement in Nehemiah 6:16, “When all our enemies heard about this, all the surrounding nations were afraid and lost their self-confidence, because they realized that this work had been done with the help of our God.”

Quote: “A river cuts through rock not because of its power, but because of its persistence.”

Leadership: Nehemiah presents great insights into what it takes to be a leader. One of my favorite quotes from the book occurs in Nehemiah 6:3. His opponents are trying to distract him from rebuilding the wall, leading to this reply, “I am doing a great work, and I cannot come down.” He did not allow himself to be distracted from what he considered to be the great work that God had called him to do.

Application: Here are eight core lessons we can learn from Nehemiah that we can apply to our own lives:

- 1) God calls us to do his work, and we need to be ready to respond to that call (Neh 2:12). God had spent years preparing Nehemiah for the work he called him to do.
- 2) True leaders identify with the people, and think in terms of “we” and “us”, not “I”. (Neh 2:17)
- 3) True vision comes from God (Neh 2:12). Nehemiah is clear that God had put the plan into his heart.
- 4) Prayer is essential to understanding the situation and asking for guidance (Neh 1, Neh 2:4). Years of prayer had prepared him for his encounter with the king.
- 5) God’s vision was simple—“rebuild the wall”. We make it complicated.
- 6) Don’t forget your vision for what God has called you to do (Neh 6:3). It is easy to let distractions and life blur our focus and turn us away from our calling. Stay true and strong.
- 7) It takes more than one person to accomplish the goal. Nehemiah built a strong team that both built the wall and protected the workers. The task was bigger than any one person could do alone.
- 8) Don’t become discouraged by adversity. The book of Nehemiah is filled with descriptions of how the opponents of rebuilding the wall attempted to thwart Nehemiah and the workers.

Discussion Questions:
