Salem Health requires the following in order to participate:

- Student must present proof of COVID-19 vaccination to Salem Health in order to participate. This includes 1st and 2nd doses of Moderna OR Pfizer OR only 1 dose of Johnson & Johnson. We are not requiring students to get boosters. We accept any copy of official documentation including COVID card, immunization form, etc.

- If a student loses their COVID card – they can visit any Pharmacy and retrieve another one.

HIGH SCHOOL SKI TRIP

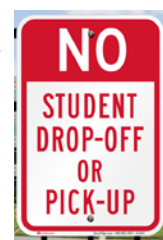
